The Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University has a proposal for starting ITEP Programmes by integrating Arts and Science subjects after obtaining NCTE's recognition as suggested by the NEP 2020. The Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University has a proposal for starting new skill-based value-added courses.

17.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University has converted all its non-/credit programmes to credit-based programmes, which indicates the preparedness of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University for credit transfers and credit storage to facilitate students' mobility, academic flexibility, freedom to choose their learning path and recognition for learning achievements. Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University students have been earning additional credits from SWAYAM and other similar courses offered by different MOOC Platforms.
