The University trains the teachers by using Tamil Computing utilizing Unicode font.

Student-Centric Learning is one of the prime objectives of the University. It is implemented in the interactive mode by allowing the students to engage in meaningful learning. The University conducts seminars, special lectures on the new developments through ICT. Students are offered courses through NPTEL, SWAYAM, Coursera and other portals. The University has a large collection of books, Journals and e-journals. The library uses Auto-Lib Library Management System.

The University adopts a comprehensive approach to solid waste management of glass, metals, and food waste. Housekeeping staff collect waste on campus and put it into movable containers, which are then transported to the designated vendors. The University emphasizes strict segregation of dry and wet waste and sanitation standards. Organic waste is converted into biogas, serving as a fuel for a composting plant produces manure for campus farming.

To manage paper waste, the University collaborates with Tamil Nadu Neelam for recycling and encouraging digital communication to reduce paper usage in Sewage Treatment Plants, and the recycled water is used for garden construction, contributing to water conservation. The University addresses air pollution by recycling used lube oil and installing rooftop solar panels to reduce energy consumption.

In E-waste management, the University conducts workshops for repurposing old electronics and collaborates with the Pollution Control Board for responsible disposal. E-waste is either reused, recycled, or purchased through the Buy-Back option by a certified E-waste management.
